The quality of your listening as a spiritual director

- It fosters trust and goodwill
- Relaxes control of this crucial meeting
- Optimizes attentiveness to what God is doing in the moment.

Promptness and patience.

- A rushed atmosphere does not create spaciousness
- Lateness doesn't make a promising start

Self-Attentiveness

- Reflection and moving into a place of presence.
- Environment matters.

The Power of pause – Creating a vast space

- Slowing down,
- Lingering in what you are hearing,
- Reflecting before talking,
- Praying with all prayer.

. Creating Welcome is conscious choice to slow down and clear listening space

Space in listening also invites space in responding – James 1:19

Let every person be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger.

• Space to Listen to inner self

- Space to listen to your body embodied listening
- Space in listening to your own yearnings, longings, motivations, wisdom, intentions

Listening in this way fosters a sense of completion.

- Your session has discernible purpose
- Your directee experiences a high level of satisfaction
- Headline themes are clearer
- Ah ha moments show up
- The experience of prayer is deeper and more meaningful

Clearing Space – Creating Welcome is about making room - an intentional slowing down.

Slowing down is not natural – but it positions us to

- Filter with intentionality rather than engage in unchecked interpretation
- Build deeper connection
- More deeply know and be more deeply known

Note to self-Always end with an encouragement about your directees efforts, movement, and growth. Celebrate that. The celebration also creates spaciousness...
