

2021 - 1st Formatio cohort began in fall. John DelHousaye joined as theologian in residence and Jim Beadle as the director of finance. John D. began a global Bible Institute training pastors & leaders. A Simple Pause app released by LuAnn Roberson. 2023 - Formatio cohort graduated, team grew again with Renee Clark as hospitality coordinator and Jess Meeks as a minister for formation.

2018 - Annual conference on spiritual formation and the church. Gem Fadling spoke about the Enneagram at an event. Offered a mental health first aid. 2020 - The staff team grew with Sheli Sloterbeek as a minister for formation/administration, and Michael Donnelly as a minister for counseling and soul care. Began offering events online during covid. 2022 - Tom Ashbrook joined as a minister for formation. Partnered with MSW Ministries at Ravenscroft with a Fernando Ortega benefit concert.


"We support SFSAZ because we want to support those who support leaders in our churches who help guide and lead us spiritually. It's truly full circle." -Brad Ghaster

#### Partnership in Ministry
